Ash Wednesday

Greeting

Leader: Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins.

People: His mercy endures forever.

Today, Ash Wednesday, is the beginning of Lent, a purple season in the church year. Purple seasons are always times to get ready. Lent is when we get ready for Easter, the happy day when Jesus rose from the dead.

Lent is forty days long – not counting Sundays. In the Old Testament, God's people were in the wilderness for forty years, and he fed them manna from heaven every day. God did this to teach everyone that there's something even more important than food, and that's God's word, the Bible. Just like it's good to eat breakfast every day, it's even more important to read or listen to God's word, the Bible, every day.

During the purple season of Lent, one of the ways we get ready for Easter is by fasting, which is when we choose to give up eating something we like, in order to remember what God's people learned in the wilderness about feeding on God's Word. Jesus did this same thing when he began his ministry with forty days of fasting in the wilderness.

We also begin Lent today by receiving the sign of the cross on our foreheads. God's Word teaches us that we all have sinned, or disobeyed God, and everyone who sins will someday die. But Jesus died on the cross for our sins, so that we might rise from the dead like him. So today we take the sign of Jesus' cross on our heads to remember his gift to us. We are so sorry that Jesus had to die on the cross for us. We don't want to sin any more. But we're also so happy that Jesus rose from the dead, and by faith *in* him, we will live forever *with* him.

A Collect for Ash Wednesday

Almighty God, you hate nothing you have made and forgive the sins of all who repent: Create in us clean hearts, so that we, being sorry for our sins and rebellion against you, may receive forgiveness from you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Burning of the Palm Fronds

Each year, we burn the palms we used to praise Jesus on Palm Sunday, as he went to the cross, in order to make our ashes, so that his cross might show on our foreheads.

(Instruct families to come one by one to place their palms in the firepit)
