## SCRIPTURE - Isaiah 25:1-9

<u>Note</u>: As you go through the material, the texts in italics are suggested answers that you are free to use as you wish. You do not have to share them with the group.

Suggestion: After reading the passage out loud together, give some time for everyone to read it again silently, then ask someone to summarize the passage.

#### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. What are the three images in this text that demonstrate God's plan
- 2. Many people in Jesus' time thought the Messiah would be a political savior who would free Israel from Roman oppression. What about passages like this from Isaiah did those expectations misunderstand?

- 3. Isaiah 25:6 speaks of a feast the Lord will "make for all peoples." Does this remind us of anything in the New Testament?
- 4. Revelation 21:4 says: "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." That sounds a lot like Isaiah 25:8. What do these verses reveal about God's character?
- 5. What does Isaiah 25:9's statement about "waiting" tell us about Christian life?
